We have more than 180 members - the largest the Forum has ever been.


Our members are made up of 8% government, 7% academia and 80% business.







Al Governance

Chair: Gabriela Mazorra de Cos, Xero Deputy Chair: Craig Pattison, Capability Collective

- Delivering Masterclasses, upskilling senior decision makers and inspiring leadership since 2023, including partnership with University of Waikato and Callaghan Innovation.
- 1 November 2023: We launched a free-to-all website (<u>aigovernance.nz</u>), powered by Callaghan Innovation, providing best practice toolkits and frameworks curated for Aotearoa New Zealand. This includes local use cases, blogs and experts.
- 15 May 2024: Launched Workshop Essentials, levelling the playing field for organisations who cannot afford external advisers.
- This Working Group continues to provide updates and relevant informative content and training materials, both via the website and partnerships with organisations, for example, the Institute of Directors.

LLMs / Gen Al

Chair: Matt Ensor, FranklyAl

- This Working Group unites subject matter experts from across Aotearoa to provide a comprehensive overview of the benefits, challenges and governance considerations associated with LLMs here.
- 12 December 2023: The 'living' white paper prototype was launched
- 22 May 2024: The full working model developed by SupaHuman AI using Google technology was launched.
- With 20 chapters covering different sectors across the motu, this group has provided the content and overseen the creation of a 'living' white paper.
 Utilising trusted sources the report will never be out of date and can be generated according to each user's needs.

Al Blueprint for Aotearoa

Chair: Tom Maasland, MinterEllisonRuddWatts Deputy Chair: Prof Albert Bifet, Waikato

- Formerly the Strategy Working Group, the intention is to help inform the government's work in this area.
- September 2023: Al Strategy Reboot workshop hosted 70 leaders from across industry, government and academia to rethink what an Al Strategy for Aotearoa may look like. The outcomes were provided to the incoming Minister Collins.
- May 2024: Uniting voices from 6 key industries to outline a 5 year view with a series of achievable actions in year one includes collaborations with IoT Alliance, EdTechNZ, AgriTechNZ and WeCreate.
- 22 May 2024: Research launched to measure <u>Al's impact on productivity in</u> <u>Aotearoa on a quarterly basis intended to</u> reveal actual levels of adoption and impact. Partnering with <u>Victoria University of</u> <u>Wellington</u> and <u>Callaghan Innovation</u>



Kāhui Māori Atamai Iahiko

Chair: Megan Tapsell, ANZ

 Formed in November 2022, this group provides a voice for Māori within the AI community and a pivotal point of knowledge and reference for all of our work

Al for the Environment

Chair: Prof Albert Bifet, Waikato Deputy Chair: David Knox, Lynker Analytics

- This Working Group runs our annual Al for the Environment Hackathon which is hosted across Aotearoa and the South Pacific.
- The festival creates a safe space for people and organisations to experience and experiment with AI and is aligned to environment and sustainability goals.
- The Working Group also considers submissions and produces other related member events.

Architecture, Engineering and Construction (AEC)

Chair: Maria Mingallon, MottMac

- This new Working Group is being established to provide thought leadership, research and to lead activities on the use of Al within AEC sectors in Aotearoa
- This is an important sector where a 1 or 2% shift in infrastructure results can have a material impact on GDP, and interest in AI is increasing.
- This group will work in collaboration with the IoT Alliance.
